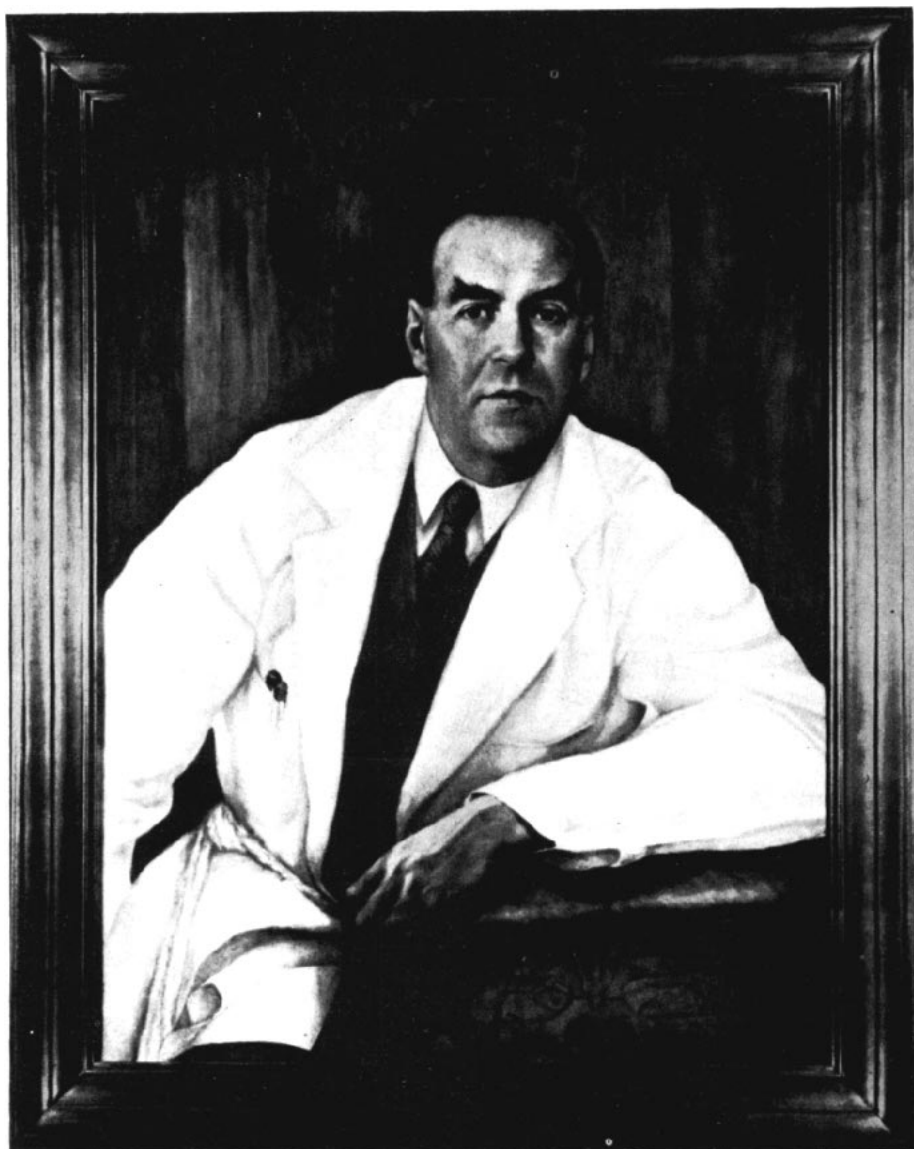




On January 15, 1940, the anniversary of the birth of Dr. T. Wingate Todd, his portrait was presented to Western Reserve University by the Bolton Fund. Dr. B. Holly Broadbent, Director of the Bolton Fund, presented the portrait, expressing the very deep gratitude of the many branches of Science that were so vastly enriched by Dr. Todd's intense interest in the betterment of human welfare. Dentistry and Orthodontics are especially indebted because of a very close association with his research in Anatomy. An eloquent tribute to his many years of ceaseless activity was the appointment of Dr. Normand L. Hoerr as Professor of Anatomy and Dr. William W. Greulich as head of the Brus' Foundation, to continue the work he so brilliantly began. Dr. Hoerr was formerly Assistant Professor of Anatomy at the University of Chicago and Dr. Greulich was Research Associate Professor in Anatomy and Anthropology at the Yale University School of Medicine. The portrait was painted by Dr. Erich von Baeyer of the Department of Roentgenology at Western Reserve University, and is hanging in the Anatomical Library, beside the entrance to the Hamann Museum, one of the most complete collections of Anthropological and Anatomical specimens in the world—fostered and promoted by Dr. Todd.
