

Louis Braun 1898-1954

In Memoriam

A man who truly gave his all for his profession and to his fellow men was Louis Braun. A batchelor who had few outside interests, he devoted his life to dentistry and especially to his chosen field of orthodontics. He took the long road home only an hour and a half after completing his last performance so capably as program chairman of the Mid-Western Component meeting of the Angle Society in Detroit, Michigan on January 19, 1954.

Dr. Braun was born April 16, 1898 in West Newton, Pennsylvania. He received his DDS at the University of Michigan in 1920. After spending some years in general practice, he returned to that university for his MS in Orthodontics. During the war and again recently, he was a member of the orthodontic staff at the University of Detroit School of Dentistry. He was a Fellow of the American College of Dentistry and a diplomate of the American Board of Orthodontics.

Dr. Braun was a member of the American and Michigan State Dental Associations and of the Detroit District Dental Society, playing a very active part in the local groups. He was one of the founders and a past president of the Downtown Dental Club of Detroit. Besides being a life member of the Detroit Dental Clinic Club, he was a past director of the Orthodontic Section. He was also a member of the Charles H. Tweed Foundation for Orthodontic Research.

His biggest day was yet to come when he was to preside as president of the Great Lakes Society of Orthodontists this coming fall in Detroit, Michigan.

His fraternal connections included Omicron Kappa Upsilon and Delta Sigma Delta, of which he was Past Grand Master of the Detroit Graduate Chapter.

Dr. Braun is survived by three sisters and a brother who is a physician.
