In Memoriam

In the passing of Dr. Donald H. Glew, Sr., we have lost a valued and esteemed colleague and friend. He was dedicated to the practice of his profession and devoted to the health and welfare of all his patients.

Dr. Glew was born in Ottumwa, Iowa, in 1900, and moved to Washington, D. C. in 1917. He received his dental education at George Washington and Georgetown Universities, receiving his D.D.S. degree in 1922 from the latter. In 1937 he entered the University of Illinois where he received graduate training in orthodontics, and on the completion of this training, he returned to Washington where he practiced his specialty until his death on April 20, 1959.

He served his profession in many

ways. He was a past-president of the Washington-Baltimore Society of Orthodontists, a member of the American Association of Orthodontists as well as the Edward H. Angle Society of Orthodontia.

Dr. Glew had served in the Dental Corps Reserve at Walter Reed Hospital; during World War II, he was a member of the Selective Service Medical Advisory Board of the District of Columbia. Dr. Glew also served as a vestryman of St. Stephen and the Incarnation Episcopal Church.

Dr. Glew is survived by his wife, Pearl B. Glew, by two sons, Dr. Donald H. Glew, Jr. and Dr. William B. Glew, and a sister, Mrs. Richard Ramsell.
