E. Allen Bishop passed away January 12 in Carmel, California at the age of sixty-six. He had moved to Carmel several months previously after practicing in Seattle since 1924.

Pete, as he was affectionately known to his friends, was a past chairman of the Northwest Component of the Angle Society, past president of the Pacific Coast Society of Orthodontists, and a past president of the Charles Tweed Foundation. Upon establishment of the graduate orthodontic department at the University of Washington Dr. Bishop became a valued member of its faculty and retained his exuberant interest in the department until his retirement.

After attending high school in Seattle he was graduated from Northwestern University Dental School. He attended the Dewey School of Orthodontia and courses offered by Drs. Strang and Tweed.

Dr. Bishop was a Mason, a member of the Nile Temple of the Shrine, a Rotarian, and was very active in the Episcopal Church.
