THOMAS J. KELLEY (1922-1979)

It was with great sorrow that we learned of the sudden death on January 10, 1979 of our friend and colleague, Thomas J. Kelley of Holyoke, Massachusetts.

After graduating from St. Louis Dental School and serving as a naval lieutenant in World War II, Tom completed his postgraduate orthodontic education at Tufts University in 1950. From that time until the present he practiced orthodontics in Holyoke and also was a visiting instructor in orthodontics at Tufts and Boston Universities. He was a diplomate of the American Board of Orthodontics, a member of the Eastern component of the Edward H. Angle Society, the Northeastern Society of the American Association of Orthodontics, and the Tweed Foundation.

Besides these many professional activities he was a charter member of the Holyoke chapter of the Sierra Club International, member of Rotary, the Defense Orientation Civilian Association of Springfield, and the Longmeadow Country Club. He was president of the Holyoke Junior Achievement Foundation. His talent and achievement also extended to sport as he was an excellent golfer.

Tom and his wife of 33 years, Rosalie, were the devoted parents of three sons, three daughters, and a granddaughter. One daughter is a graduate of Tufts University College of Dental Medicine and a matriculant in postgraduate orthodontics at the University of Pennsylvania.

This quiet, likeable, and modest man will be missed by his family and his many friends, patients, and colleagues.
